1.	Greet	<ul><li>Hello.</li><li>Hey.</li><li>Good morning.</li><li>How are you today?</li></ul>	
2.	<ul> <li>My name is John (orMaryanne, Ms. Smith, Sister Betty, etc.).</li> <li>I'm the housekeeper (orCNA, administrator, nurse, etc.).</li> </ul>		
3.	Use Name	<ul> <li>Hi, Ellen (or Mark, Dr. Miller, Miss Debbie, etc., or other name).</li> <li>Hi, Grandpa (doc, JJ, etc., or other nick name).</li> <li>Honey, Dear, Sweetie **only if regionally appropriate**</li> </ul>	
4.	Smile/Eye	<ul> <li>Smiles and</li> <li>Makes eye contact (or attempts to make eye contact) for at least 2 seconds</li> </ul>	
5.	Physical Contact	<ul> <li>Shakes resident's hand</li> <li>Rubs resident's back</li> <li>Gives a hug</li> <li>Touches resident's face, leg, arm, shoulder, etc. (appropriately)</li> </ul>	
6.	Approach	<ul> <li>Approaches from front</li> <li>Makes attempt to get in front of resident</li> <li>Moves resident's chair or wheelchair back, and then gets in front of them</li> <li>Moves to the side of the resident if approaching from front not possible</li> </ul>	
7.	Eye Level	<ul> <li>Crouches (bends, stoops, squats, etc.) to eye level or below</li> <li>Stands next to resident (if resident is standing)</li> <li>Knee on the floor</li> <li>Sit next to resident on chair, couch, bed, etc., to eye level</li> </ul>	
8.	Calm	<ul> <li>Relaxed tone of voice</li> <li>Voice pitch not too high</li> <li>Voice not too loud (unless resident is hard of hearing)</li> <li>Appears not to be rushed</li> <li>Not pushy, aggressive, or insistent</li> </ul>	
9.	Ask/Discuss/ Assess	<ul> <li>Asks/discusses how resident is doing</li> <li>Asks/discusses how resident is feeling</li> <li>Asks how a task is going</li> <li>How's that leg today?</li> <li>Are you feeling better today?</li> <li>Are you hungry?</li> <li>Are you tired?</li> <li>Do you need to go to the bathroom?</li> </ul>	
10.	15 Seconds	<ul> <li>Talks to resident at least 15 seconds total time (not just to another person in the room)</li> </ul>	
11.	Explain (continued on next page)	<ul> <li>Explains task at hand. Examples: <ul> <li>I'm going to turn you now.</li> <li>We're going to brush your teeth today.</li> <li>I'm here to pick up your laundry.</li> </ul> </li> <li>It's time to go to dinner.</li> <li>States one task/step at a time <ul> <li>Now I'm going to button your shirt.</li> <li>Can you hold your glass for me?</li> <li>Can you put your glass to your mouth?</li> <li>Can I help you put your glass to your mouth?</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

11.	Explain (continued)	<ul> <li>Asks resident to do an activity</li> <li>Let's go for a walk.</li> <li>Would you like to go and listen to some music with me?</li> <li>Should we go outside to listen to the birds?</li> <li>Could I sit and visit with you?</li> <li>Time reality</li> <li>It's 8 a.m.</li> <li>It's morning.</li> <li>Did you know today is Thanksgiving?</li> </ul>	
12.	Involve in Care/ Activity	<ul> <li>Involves or attempts to involve resident in some way with a personal care or activity</li> <li>Can you hold the toothbrush for me?</li> <li>Hold this.</li> <li>Please stand up.</li> <li>Now, put your arm in your sleeve.</li> <li>Can you put your foot up here so I can tie your shoe?</li> <li>Asks resident to be involved in an activity.</li> <li>Can you help me with this puzzle?</li> <li>Look at the nice dog. Can you help me give him some food?</li> <li>I'm folding towels today. I'd appreciate your helping me.</li> <li>We have a real mess over here. Can you help me clean it up?</li> </ul>	
13.	Resident's Life	<ul> <li>Mentions something about resident's life</li> <li>Where were you born?</li> <li>Where do you live?</li> <li>What was your mother's name?</li> <li>What is your profession?</li> <li>What do you like to do?</li> <li>How many sisters and brothers do you have?</li> <li>Engages resident about aspects of the resident's life</li> <li>So I hear you were an attorney. Tell me about your favorite case.</li> <li>You told me you used to run. Did you do any marathons?</li> <li>I see you have your dress on. Are you going out?</li> <li>What a beautiful tie. Where did you get it? I think I'd like one.</li> <li>Your hair looks beautiful. Did you go to the beauty shop today?</li> </ul>	
14.	Comfort	<ul> <li>Repositions resident in wheelchair, chair, bed, etc.</li> <li>Fluffs or props up with pillows</li> <li>Offers or tucks in blanket</li> <li>Brings a sweater, etc., to make resident more comfortable</li> <li>Brings a drink or food item</li> <li>Brings a personal item</li> <li>Asks if he/she can bring resident anything</li> <li>Asks if he/she can do anything for the resident</li> <li>Sits with resident</li> <li>Helps with a personal care such as teeth or hair</li> </ul>	
15.	Share	<ul> <li>Shares verbally – something that worked or didn't work with resident</li> <li>Tells another staff member</li> <li>Tells a family member</li> <li>Tells a friend of the resident</li> <li>Tells nurse to record something in the resident's chart</li> </ul>	
16.	Write	<ul> <li>Writes a note on white board, by bed, in bathroom, etc.</li> <li>Writes something in the 24-hour report</li> <li>Writes something in the assignment sheet</li> <li>Writes something in the communication book</li> <li>Writes on something that may become part of the resident's chart</li> <li>Writes in behavior tracking document (or other similar document)</li> </ul>
